Regional State Life List

Kevin Richmond released his central life list number and it not only zooms up to the top of that list, but it's also the highest tally within any state region. Congratulations to Kevin on amassing such a large tally! Baum also reports for the first time and has the second most for this region.

Also significant is the new southern region life list leader, with Dan reporting for the first time and having a tally over 350. With all the excellent birds found in this region during 2008, a number of birders are approaching a southern regional life list of 300. The late Jim Landing left behind his state life list and we were able to work through it to calculate his tally for the northern region, currently the second highest on record. Regional Big Years

The main highlight of the dozen new additions to this list was Dan Kassebaum's exceptional new record for a Southern Illinois Big Year. It's a challenge to exceed 300 species for the whole of Illinois, but to do it two years in a row within a single region is amazing. He had broken his former record by midfall!

The top two central reports broke the former record by a sizable amount. Baum's 264 sets a challenging standard for future birders.

New northern reports include the second and third best ever (Stokie's 282 and Madsen's 280). With the current volume and timeliness of sightings available to birders, it would seem the top spot in this list (one of the oldest existing in Lister's Corner) could fall someday. Also noteworthy are Stotz's 277 (6th best all-time) and Secker's 273 (8th best). It appears a northern 275 tally would represent an excellent achievement.
